Workers regulate content of program in accordance with patients'/clients' capabilities, needs and interest.

Those skills include: Word Processing, Data Base Management, and Spreadsheets. Other skills include using Email, Internet, Printing and Program duplication. Jobs include working with all types of computer hardware such as: Desk Top Computers, Laptop Computers, NetBooks, and Computer Tablet PCs. Some jobs require working on large mainframe computers and computer network servers. Knowledge of program languages (the way computers communicate) is essential if you are going to develop software applications. The business data processing industry is very dynamic and is always changing. Staying abreast of new technologies is essential. The future is bright for this career area.
